

Do low-voltage cables require cable trays and supports



Article Overview

Low-voltage cables do not always need to be placed in cable trays, but they can be installed in trays if desired, following NEC guidelines and separation requirements.

NEC Guidelines for Low-Voltage Cables

Cable trays are primarily a support system for electrical, power, signal, and communication cables, including low-voltage circuits such as Class 2 and Class 3 wiring, control circuits, and optical fiber cables (NEC Article 392) . According to NEC rules, low-voltage cables rated 600 volts or less can share a cable tray with other low-voltage cables without additional separation, provided the tray fill and support requirements are met . However, cables operating above 600 volts must either be metal-clad (Type MC) or separated by a solid barrier from lower-voltage cables .

Practical Considerations

While low-voltage cables are not strictly required to be in cable trays, using trays offers several advantages:

- Organization and support: Trays provide a structured pathway for routing multiple cables, making installation and maintenance easier .
- Protection: Solid-bottom or ventilated trays protect cables from physical damage, debris, or sagging, which is particularly useful in commercial or industrial environments
