

Electrical boxes installed in evacuation routes



Article Overview

Electrical boxes and wiring in protected escape routes are strictly limited to essential safety services and must comply with fire-resisting and fire-sterile requirements.

Protected Escape Routes

A protected escape route is a path enclosed with fire-resisting construction, designed to allow safe evacuation to a place of safety during an emergency. These routes are typically implemented in larger or complex buildings where longer travel distances increase risk. They must be fire and smoke-resisting and ideally contain no combustibile materials, including electrical equipment, except for essential safety services such as lighting, fire alarms, and emergency systems (BS 7671:2018+A2:2022, BS 9991:2024) .

Electrical Boxes and Wiring

Electrical boxes, outlets, and cables in protected escape routes are highly restricted:

- Only essential services are permitted, such as emergency lighting, fire detection, and alarm systems. General-purpose outlets or non-critical equipment are not allowed .
- Cables must be fire-resistant or installed in non-flame-propagating containment (e.g., steel conduits) to prevent fire spread and limit smoke production. Compliance with BS EN 60332-1-2 and BS EN 61386-1 or BS EN 50085 is recommended
