

Fiber optic connector closure reserved length



Article Overview

The typical reserved length of fiber inside a splice closure is approximately 1 meter of bare fiber on each side of the splice, with additional lengths for buffer tubes and cable anchoring.

Reserved Fiber Length

When installing a fiber optic splice closure, it is important to leave enough fiber length to allow for splicing, proper routing, and neat storage in the splice trays. Generally, loose tube cables should extend from the closure entrance to the splice tray, where they are secured, and then approximately 1 meter of bare fiber is reserved on each side of the splice for organization and future maintenance . This reserved length ensures that fibers are not stressed or pinched when trays are stacked or covers are applied.

Buffer Tube and Cable Management

- Buffer tubes should be stripped to the length recommended by the manufacturer to reach the splice tray without tension.
- Strength members and metallic components must be properly anchored and bonded to the closure to prevent movement and maintain mechanical integrity .
- For closures handling ribbon fibers, special care is required to route ribbons in the correct bending direction, especially for hard ribbon cables, while newer flex ribbons allow more flexibility
