To connect a single-mode fiber port to a multimode (dual-mode) port, you need a fiber media converter or mode-conditioning solution that matches wavelengths, connectors, and signal types.

Understanding Fiber Types

Single-mode fiber (SMF) has a small core (8–10 microns) and transmits light along a single path, making it ideal for long-distance, high-speed communication over tens of kilometers . Multimode fiber (MMF) has a larger core (50–100 microns) and allows multiple light paths, suitable for shorter distances, typically up to 2 km depending on the optics . Directly connecting SMF to MMF without adaptation can result in significant signal loss due to mode mismatch .

Single-Fiber vs. Dual-Fiber Transceivers

- Single-fiber (BiDi) transceivers use one fiber for both transmitting and receiving signals, employing different wavelengths for each direction (e.g., TX1310/RX1550) and must be paired correctly .
- Dual-fiber transceivers use separate fibers for transmit (TX) and receive (RX) signals, typically at the same wavelength, and are simpler to deploy but require two fibers per link .
