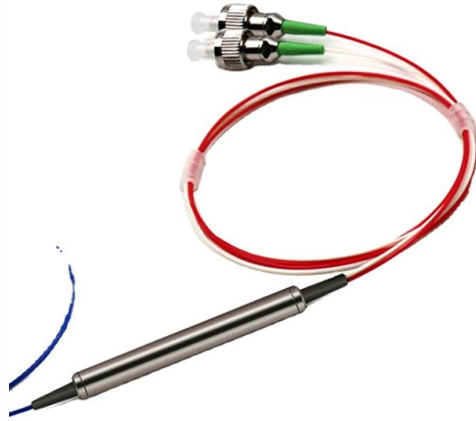

NRZ Active Optical Devices (AOCs) are high-performance optical transceivers and cables designed for reliable, high-speed data transmission in data centers and enterprise networks.

Overview of NRZ Active Optical Devices

NRZ (Non-Return-to-Zero) modulation is widely used in optical transceivers and active optical cables to transmit data efficiently over fiber. These devices include QSFP28, QSFP-DD, and OSFP modules, supporting speeds from 100G to 200G and beyond, depending on the number of lanes and fiber type . NRZ AOCs are ideal for short- to medium-range connections, typically within racks or between adjacent racks in data centers.

Key Features

- High-speed data transmission: NRZ AOCs operate at up to 25Gb/s per lane, supporting aggregate bandwidths of 100G, 200G, or higher .
- Form factors: Common modules include QSFP28 (100G), QSFP-DD (200G), and OSFP (400G+), compatible with standard MSA specifications .
- Fiber type: Available for single-mode or multi-mode fiber, with reach ranging from 10 meters to 100 meters or more depending on the module .
- Connectors: Typically use duplex LC or MPO/MTP connectors for easy integration .
- Compliance: Certified to IEEE standards (e.g., 802.3ba, 802.3bm) and RoHS, ensuring safety and interoperability
