

Should low-voltage cables that pass through cable trays be run through conduits



Article Overview

Low-voltage cables in cable trays do not always require conduit, but conduit is recommended or required in high-risk, outdoor, underground, or code-mandated environments.

Tray Cable Installation Basics

Tray cables (TC, TC-ER) are designed for open installation in cable trays and can often be run without conduit, as long as they are properly supported and protected from excessive mechanical damage, per NEC Article 392 and Article 336 . Cable trays provide easy access for maintenance and allow multiple cables to be routed efficiently without the need for individual conduits .

When Conduit Is Recommended or Required

Conduit may be necessary for low-voltage cables in the following situations:

- High-risk environments: Areas with forklifts, heavy machinery, or high foot traffic where cables could be crushed or abraded .
- Outdoor or underground installations: Conduit protects against moisture, UV exposure, and extreme weather. Standard tray cables must be in conduit if not rated for direct burial
