

# What is the reserved depth for the fiber optic panel

The reserved depth for fiber optic panels typically ranges from 24 to 36 inches (60–90 cm) for standard installations, with deeper placement required under roadways or high-load areas.

### Standard Installation Depths

For general residential or commercial areas, fiber optic panels or enclosures are usually installed at a depth of 24 to 36 inches (60–90 cm) to protect against accidental damage from landscaping, soil compression, or minor surface activities (commonly recommended by NEC and industry standards). This depth ensures the panel is accessible for maintenance while providing adequate protection.

### High-Load or Roadway Installations

When panels are installed under driveways, public roads, or areas with heavy vehicle traffic, the reserved depth should be increased to 36 to 48 inches (90–120 cm). In these cases, panels are often placed within a protective conduit to withstand compressive loads and prevent damage from soil compaction or traffic.

- Frost-prone areas: Depth should exceed the local frost line to prevent frost heave, which can damage both panels and cables ...
